On January 7th, HSA's Executive Committee met to discuss the annual calendar and other business:

- The club's finances are in great shape—a good thing as our Harbormaster acknowledges our sturdy little rescue boat is reaching the end of its life and will require replacement sooner rather than later. Anyone need a unique yard feature?
- New dry moorage eligibility rules and volunteer expectations and requirements will be finalized and added to the HSA year book for 2023.
- A fresh look at HSA's insurance needs is underway with research ongoing regarding costs and coverage levels for the club's programs, equipment, and volunteer members. - The committee formally approved the new position of Public Programs Coordinator to facilitate interactions with the public and park staff as they host programs like ODNR's Ohio Women's Outdoor Adventures weekend.
- A Public Programs website is being developed (complimenting HSA's current website) for public on-line sign-ups and HSA club member volunteer sign-ups. It will be monitored by our new coordinator.
- The committee continued its brainstorming on ways to better include its much-valued cruiser members and the entire Acton Lake sailing community in its public programs and racing calendar events.







Racing "Ladder Rungs" & Bob's Acton SkyCam



Our very own Bob Taylor passed the FAA's rigorous commercial remote pilot exam a couple weeks ago and received his Unmanned Aerial Vehicle certification! So now that HSA has its very own legitimate SkyCam operator, one might ask "how much wind do those little propellers generate on a windless August Sunday and do the US Sailing rules allow Bob to fill his sails with this new-found wind?"


Well, Bob's intent is less nefarious. He looks forward to photographing some of our races from above to better understand tactics at the starting line and along the course. Acton Lake is famous for its wind shifts and he hopes to share how various skippers play these shifts to their advantage (see graphic).


No doubt Bob will also be visualizing the course's conceptual "ladder rungs" from above as they pivot left and right with the shifts. Like the international date line, these ladder rungs are not painted on the water surface. However, they are certainly present in a winning skipper's mind just as clearly.



• If you know your boat's upwind sailing angle, you can picture the ladder rungs on the water. • For example, in medium wind, most boats sail upwind at about 45° from the wind direction. • Imagine two lines, each 45° from the centerline of your boat. • One line shows you the wind direction and the other line shows the direction of the ladder rung.

• Which end of the line is favored? • How could you tell on the water? • Answers • The pin end is on a higher ladder rung and therefore is favored • If you point the boat head to wind in the middle of the line, your bow will point more closely to the favored end.








Acton Lake and Hueston Woods Resort—Hidden gems!


